- Recreation Master Plan Completion – a long term blueprint for maximizing all the amenities Huron-Kinloss offers is critical to the economic health of the municipality. The Master Plan should be completed and efforts made to prioritize the recommendations.
- Enhance recent efforts to diversify tax base and continue to seek opportunities to leverage the benefits from Bruce Powers massive investment in the region.
- Ongoing investments in updating aging core infrastructure including rural roads and bridges need to be maintained.
- Long standing partnerships and relationships with Bruce County, our surrounding municipalities and the private sector should be reviewed and assessed to ensure they are still providing the best value to our residents.
